The Council is a consultee on al planning applications, and has also considered applications beyond the parish boundary, such as proposals at the Old Forge in Wroxton Lane. The Council has agreed to jointly finance with OCC the provision of kerbs in Church Lane, and is waiting to hear from OCC when this will be done.
