The Council's accounts for the year to 31 March 2020 have now been reviewed by the Council's internal auditor, who has confirmed that there are no matters which he wishes to draw to the attention of the Council. The Internal Auditor report, Annual Governance Statement and Annual Accounting Statements are attached at Annex 1 to this report, and Members are **recommended** to resolve that these documents be approved.

The Council is no longer required to submit its annual accounts for external audit, and, as last year, can now certify that it is exempt as neither gross income nor gross expenditure exceeded £25,000. A copy of the Certificate of Exemption is attached at Annex 2, and Members are **recommended** to resolve that the Council is exempt so that this certificate can be sent to the external auditor.

6) Parking issues at Wroxton Lane

Following the last meeting, as agreed, the Engineer retained by the Council submitted a pre-application advice request to Cherwell District Council, seeking their views on the proposed parking area at Wroxton Lane. The conclusion that the Council's planning officer has come to is as follows:-

"In consideration of the proposals we need to undertake a balancing exercise to examine whether any adverse impacts of a development would be outweighed by the benefits such that, notwithstanding the harm, it could be considered sustainable development within the meaning given in the NPPF.

The proposals would provide additional parking for residential properties within the village and would potentially alleviate pressures on demand for on-street parking within the village. It is considered that there would be a clear community benefit in this respect.

However, the proposals would result in a visually intrusive form of development that would fail to preserve the overriding character and appearance of this attractive edge of village location and

surrounding Conservation Area, resulting in environmental harm; and would further potentially result in highway safety issues.

Overall it is considered that the proposal's benefits would be significantly and demonstrably outweighed by the identified harm and therefore unfortunately any planning application for these proposals is very unlikely to be considered favourably."

A copy of both the application and the full response are attached as appendices to this report. It is difficult to see how the Council can resolve this parking problem, unless it is prepared to contest a likely planning refusal.

7) Applications for charitable and other donations

Since the last meeting the Council has received a request for funding from Marie Curie Nurses. They provide nursing support to those dying both in their homes and in hospices.
